<p><b>Schools Sports Network.</b></p> <p>The school has continued to invest in the Schools Sport Network which represents real value for money in terms of providing staff with access to continuing professional development opportunities. This enables the school to offer a range of sporting and physical educational activities for all children. Importantly this year our PE leader has attended training to implement and develop a new assessment tool for PE. The Sports Premium will be used to provide training for all staff in utilising the new framework and assessment tools which will provide a sustainable means of monitoring and assessing children’s progress across a range of skills.</p> <p>Leadership time to plan and prepare curriculum activities, establish whole school strategy and develop network opportunities with other schools through the Schools Sports Network.</p> <p>Last year’s investment to improve the playing surface of our sports field has been extremely successful with the field being ready to use after the Easter break. We are now using part of the fund to ensure we retain specialist advice and maintenance on an annual basis</p> <p><b>The children have benefitted from a wealth of sporting activities:-</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Benchball for our Year 2 children. Years 5 &amp; 6 also took part later in the year.</li> <li>• Year 5 athletics at Brumby Outwood. Children took part in ‘Skip for Life’ in January</li> <li>• New Age Curling at Brumby for our Reception children</li> <li>• Quick Sticks hockey during March, Year 4 Mini Olympics</li> <li>• Some of our Year 5 children have taken part in orienteering. Children also took part in Cricket coaching</li> <li>• Athletics for our Year 3 children. Our school was also very well represented at the annual Kids of Steel</li> <li>• The PE &amp; Sports Premium also helps to pay for transport to and from many of these sporting events.</li> <li>• Four of our Key Stage 2 children have undergone training to become ambassadors enabling them to promote games and PE.</li> </ul> <p><b>Our children also enjoy of school activities and clubs either funded or part funded through the PE initiative:-</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Street dance workshops led by a qualified dance teacher. This year our dancers attended a primary school showcase.</li> <li>• Basketball sessions including a termly tournament</li> <li>• Phizzy Fun Club to encourage younger children to enjoy physical activity</li> <li>• Football training on Tuesdays after school</li> </ul> <p><b>Longer term plans:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Further staff training to ensure physical education and sporting activities are sustainable and promote an active life-style.
