Support for review and reflection - considering the 5 key indicators from DfE, what development needs are a priority for your setting and your pupils now and why? Use the space below to reflect on previous spend and key achievements and areas for development.

Key achievements to date until July 2019:

- Children developing their skills in all areas of the PE curriculum and enjoying sport. Evidence can be seen in photographs and by speaking to the children.
- After school clubs (judo, football, Tae Kwon Do, cheerleading and dance) continue to run successfully. Registers have been taken.
- Children throughout the school are taking part in active lessons including Literacy and Numeracy, these activities are included in the 30 minutes of activity a day. Timetables and planning can be looked at.
- All children from reception to Y6 have taken part in 'skip4life' and 'healthy me' sessions, this year we are doing 'it's catching' (this did not happen due to Covid-19)
- Sports achievements recognised in our out of this world assembly
- Scrap books used to record achievements and participation in a variety of sports activities
- School games gold mark achieved for 4 years running
- Staff are more confident to deliver quality PE lessons. PE lead has had informal discussions with staff and staff skills audits carried out.
- OTrack is used as an assessment system
- Primary steps schemes of work are used throughout the school
- Children (Y1-6) have taken part in a wide range of intra and inter school competitions. Less active children have also taken part in 'Do yourself proud' events such as get glowing, colour runs and fun runs. Participation rates and the competition record can be looked at.
- Whole year groups have taken part in sports events at our local secondary school
- Children in Y4 and 6 have improved their swimming and water safety skills. 86.67% of Y6 pupils can now swim 25m. 100% of Y6 have completed water safety skills.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Staff ensure Active sessions are taking place during the school day. Continue to update resources to enable this to happen. Evidence will come from lesson observations, lesson plans and timetables.
- Staff training so that staff are competent to teach quality lessons. Evidence will come from lesson observations and talking to staff. A staff skills audit has also been completed and the results have been analysed to book future CPD. Ask an early years specialist (Kate) to come into school (and PE lead to work with her at her school) and Owen Denovan who will work with staff to develop their competency. The training was scheduled but did not take place due to Covid 19
- Swimming sessions will continue to ensure children are competent in the water. Evidence will come from NL swimming records. Y6 booster sessions also need organising. These did not happen due to Covid 19.
- A wider range of extra-curricular activities needs to be offered, staffing needs to be organised for these sessions. Evidence of which clubs the children want to attend and are attending will come from pupil voice surveys and registers.
- Enable all children to take part in a get ahead partnership event. Children have taken part in competitions, tournaments, training events and do yourself proud events. The evidence will come from the competition log.
- Provide more intra school sports events and competitions. The evidence will come from the completion log.
- PE lead needs to observe lessons and feedback to staff. Evidence will come from lesson observation sheets.
- Meet with Sarah from the Get ahead partnership in order to organise whole year group events because we can no longer use Outwood Brumby.
