### PE Kit

Plain white round necked T-shirt, plain black shorts and black plimsolls or (predominately black) plain trainers

Optional black sweatshirt and joggers for outdoor PE; a draw string bag to hold all PE items in

All jewellery must be removed on PE days, pupils with long hair are expected to tie it back for PE as it can be dangerous on gym apparatus and during games lessons

### Jewellery

No jewellery is permitted, with the exception of a wristwatch (no smart watches) and one pair of small studded earrings

All children will require a freshly filled water bottle (containing just water) to be brought to school daily
