Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Farm	An area of land and its building, used for growing crops and rearing animals.
Mammals	An animal that is warm blooded. The females feed their young with milk
Amphibians	An animal that is cold blooded and born in water.
Reptiles	An animal that has dry scaly skin and lays soft shelled eggs on land.
Birds	A warm blooded, egg laying animal with feathers, wings and a beak.
Carnivore	An animals that feeds on other animals. A meat eater.
Herbivore	An animal that feeds on plants. A plant eater.
Omnivore	An animal that feeds on other animals and plants. It eats meat and plants.
Habitat	The natural home or environment of an animal.
Crops	A plant grown on a large scale.
Bees	A winged insect which collect nectar and pollen and produces wax and honey.
Life cycle	A series of changes a living thing passes from beginning to end over time.
