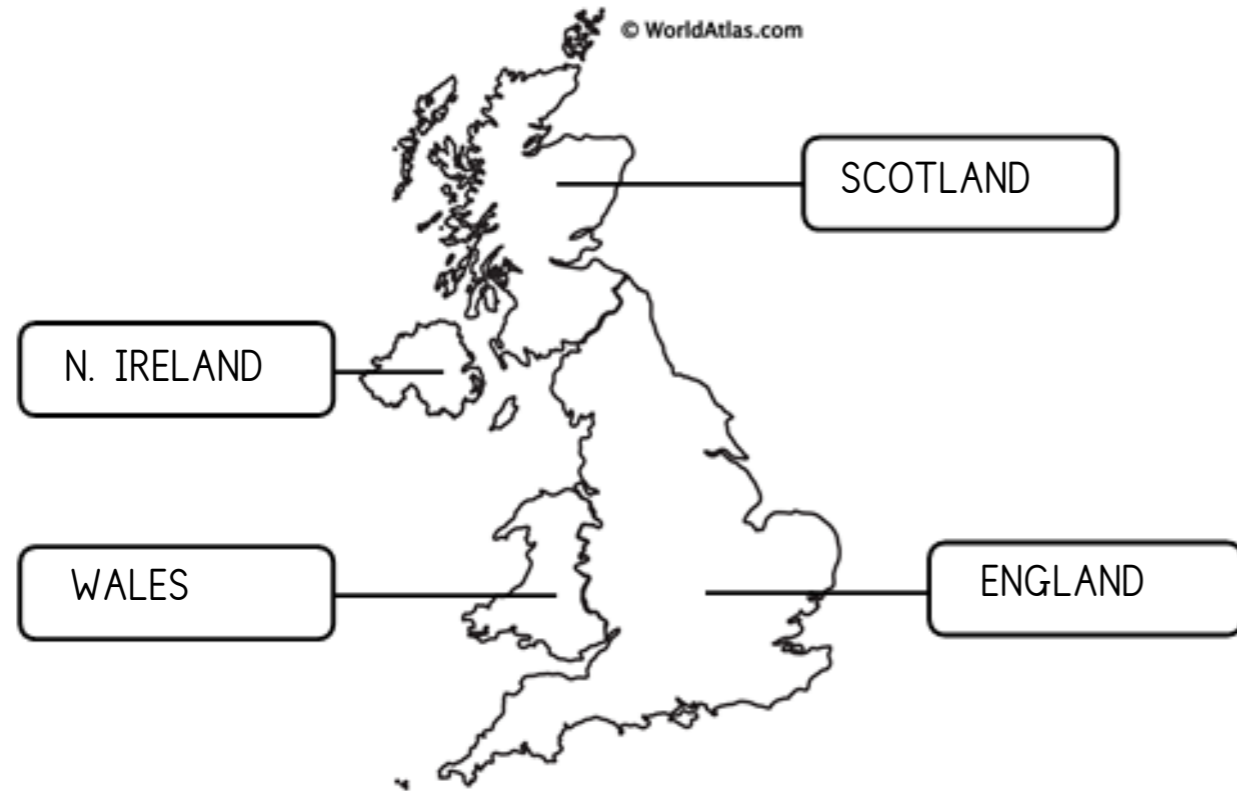


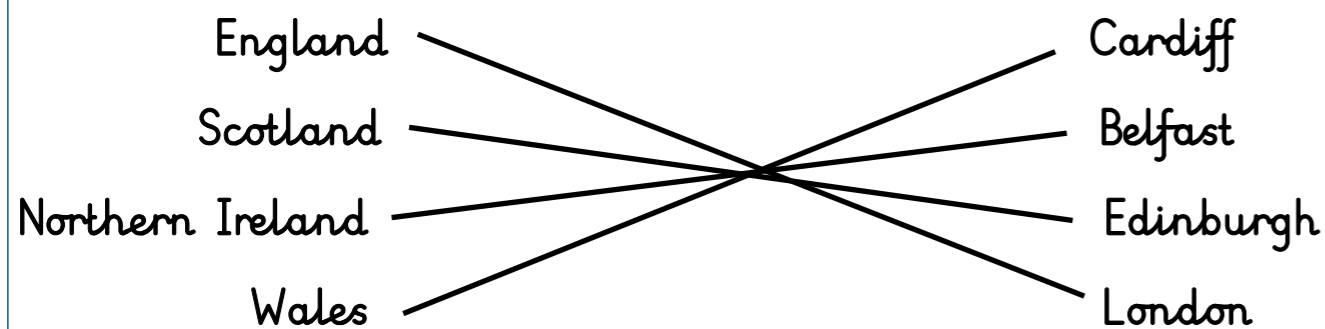

Subject Specific Vocabulary	
town	A built up area with a name and defined boundaries. Bigger than a village, but smaller than a city.
village	A group of houses and associated buildings, larger than a hamlet and smaller than a town, situated in a rural area.
England	A country forming the largest and southernmost part of the United Kingdom, and containing the capital, London.
Scotland	A country forming the northernmost part of the United Kingdom and containing the capital, Edinburgh.
Wales	A country of the United Kingdom, to the west of central England, and containing the capital Cardiff.
Northern Ireland	A province of the United Kingdom that occupies the north-eastern part of Ireland, comprised of six counties of Ulster, and containing the capital Belfast.
map	A diagram of an area of land or sea, showing physical and human features.
country	A nation with its own government, occupying a particular territory.
capital city	The place that functions as the seat of government and administrative centre of a country.
English Channel	The sea channel separating southern England from northern France.
