Sticky Knowledge
Scunthorpe was made up of 5 small villages. These were Scunthorpe, Frodingham, Crosby, Brumby and Ashby.
Rowland Winn was born on 19th February 1820 and died 17th January 1893. Rowland Winn is famous of Nostell Priory, near Wakefield, he lived in the 1850s in another family property, Appleby Hall near Scunthorpe, and married Harriet Dumaresque. Aware that the area had produced iron in Roman times, he searched for ironstone on his land, and found it in 1859. He marketed it to iron-makers, leased land for mining, mined his own ore and encouraged the building of iron works. To transport the iron and to bring the coal necessary for the smelting, Winn campaigned for a railway to be built, which required the passage of an Act of Parliament. The Trent, Ancholme and Grimsby Railway opened in 1866, and Winn also built 193 houses in New Frodingham and enlarged the local school. Later, he financed the building of Scunthorpe Church of England School and St John's Church.
Scunthorpe is a town in North Lincolnshire with a population of around 82,334, and famous for its steelwork industry.
The Sheffield family lived on the site since 1539 and the family's titles include Dukes of Buckingham and Normandy and Sheffield baronets. It replaced a previous 17th century building. The hall was used as a hospital during the war. In 1963 the Sheffield finally moved out of the hall and the North Lincolnshire Council took over the building and the park itself is now a country park.
Rowland Winn provided housing and education for his workers and their children he was a philanthropist.
