


History - The Ancient Romans



Subject Specific Vocabulary	
ancient	Belonging to the very distant past and no longer in existence.
invasion	Invading a country or region with an armed force.
AD	Anno Domini (number of years after the traditional date of Christ's birth)
ВС	Before Christ (number of years before the traditional date of Christ's birth)
Roman	Relating to ancient Rome or its empire or people.
empire	an extensive group of states or countries ruled over by a single leader
conquest	Taking control of a place or people by military force.
Celt	a member of a group of peoples living in much of Europe (including Britain) pre-Roman times.
rebellion	The action or process of resisting authority or control
