



Geography-Study of a European country



Subject Specific Vocabulary	
Natural disaster	A natural events such as a flood, earthquake or hurricane that causes great damage or loss of life.
erupt	(of a volcano) become active and eject lava, ash and gases.
Volcano	A mountain or hill, typically conical, having a crater or vent through which lava, rock fragments, hot vapour, and gas are or have been erupted from the earth's crust.
topography	The arrangement of the natural and artificial physical features of an area.
Mountain range	A series of mountains or hills ranged in a line and connected by high ground.
Compass points	The directions on the magnetic compass.
continent	Any of the world's continuous expanses of land.
